## Banquet will benefit heart health for women

PRINCETON BOROUGH -- A banquet to benefit the Women's Heart Foundation will be held tomorrow at 6 p.m. at the Nassau Inn on Palmer Square.

The "Profiles in Courage" event will also mark the beginning of a partnership between the foundation and Defibtech -- manufacturer of automatic external defibrillators (AEDs) -- that aims to combat sudden cardiac arrest through education and by making life-saving AEDs more affordable and available in the community and workplace.

"Our aim is to make AEDs more available and accessible in the community, and in the process save more lives. As a nonprofit, the WHF can offer the sale of this device both as a tax-exempt purchase and tax-deductible donation. Another advantage is that purchasing the device through the WHF helps fund wellness and prevention programs," said Bonnie Arkus, founder and volunteer director of the Women's Heart Foundation.

Jessica Melore, a motivational speaker, and Glenn W. Laub, Defibtech's CEO, will speak during the event, which will also include a silent art auction with open bar and hors d'oeuvres, dinner and the presentations. Tickets are \$100.
