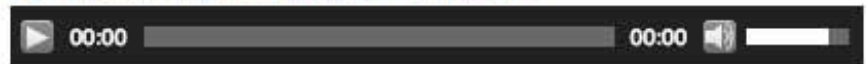




# [11/17/16] Douglas County Sheriff's Office To Receive Grant To Help Add AED's To Patrol Cars

The Douglas County Sheriff's Office is ending the 2016 year on a high note- with some recent much needed additions.

Earlier this year, Douglas County Sheriff, Harvey Gjesdal announced the addition of an updated armored vehicle, which deputies recently unveiled for the public.

Now, Sheriff Gjesdal is announcing that his office will soon have a new evidence storage facility and just this week, the Douglas County Sheriff's Office was awarded an \$8,000 grant for the purchase of AED's in patrol vehicles.

Sheriff Gjesdal says his office has been working hard to add Automatic External Defibrillators to every patrol car in the fleet, and he received word last week that the Community Foundation of north central Washington will be awarding funding to help in that effort...

Gjesdal says that currently his office shells out roughly \$30,000 annually to rent a facility used to store evidence – and just last week, the county began a site development plan that will eventually lead to an on-site evidence room and storage space...
