Defibrillator donated by Inch Lough Wildfowling Club

An Inishowen group has donated a new AED defibrillator to one of the peninsula's most popular destinations for walkers.

Inch Lough Wildfowling Club donated and constructed the AED defibrillator at Inch Wildfowl Reserve in Burt.

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a portable device, which checks the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm.

Defibrillators are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest, a condition in which the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating.

The defibrillator donated by Inch Lough Wildfowling Club is situated in McGrath's car park, Inch Island. Local resident, Darren Doherty kindly agreed to provide power to the unit.

In the case of a suspected cardiac emergency, anyone needing assistance is asked to phone 999 and request the ambulance code for the defibrillator.
